

REGULATIONS OF THE XIII INTERNATIONAL SCIENTIFIC CONFERENCE "Tourism in Social Sciences" organized on 13-14th May, 2024 ("Regulations")

§ 1

Term and duration

1. These Rules and Regulations define the rights and obligations of the Participants of the Conference "Tourism in Social Sciences" (hereinafter referred to as the "Conference"), which will be held on 13-14th May, 2024, in hybrid form in Krakow on the premises of the Jagiellonian University, in the building at 4 Łojasiewicza St., and simultaneously through the means of electronic communication application platform MS Teams enabling live streaming of the Conference (hereinafter referred to as the "Platform").
2. The Conference is organized by the Jagiellonian University, 24 Gołębia St., 31-007 Kraków, Faculty of Management and Social Communication of the Jagiellonian University, Institute of Entrepreneurship of the Jagiellonian University (hereinafter referred to as "UJ") and Polish Economic Society in Szczecin, 66 Mickiewicza St., 71-101 Szczecin (hereinafter referred to as "PTE") (hereinafter referred to as "Organizers").
3. The Conference shall be held under the patronage of the Rector of the Jagiellonian University (hereinafter referred to as "Patron").
4. The Scientific Committee of the Conference appointed by the Organizer (hereinafter referred to as the "Scientific Committee") shall provide scientific supervision of the Conference.
5. On the part of the Jagiellonian University, the Conference was financed and organized within the framework of the activity CONFERENCES AND SEMINARS at the Faculty of Management and Social Communication of the Jagiellonian University within the framework of the strategic program Excellence Initiative at the Jagiellonian University.
6. The participant of the Conference is any adult natural person with full legal capacity:
 - a) interested in participating in the Conference;
 - b) or invited by the Organizer to participate in the Conference as a guest (hereinafter referred to as "Guest") or keynote speaker (hereinafter referred to as "Keynote speaker"); who, by 09.05.2024 at the latest, applied/confirmed their desire to participate in the Conference in the manner referred to in § 2 of the Regulations, accepted the rules of participation in the Conference referred to in the Regulations, and received an email from the Organizer about their qualification to participate in the Conference (hereinafter referred to as "Participant").
7. The Rules and Regulations are made available to Participants on the Conference website <https://przedsiębiorczosc.uj.edu.pl/tns2024> (hereinafter referred to as the "Conference Website"), in Polish and English language versions, in a manner that allows its downloading.
8. The Organizer reserves the right to change the Rules of Procedure due to changes in generally applicable laws and the need to adjust the Rules of Procedure to this change, in particular to adjust the formula of the Conference to the restrictions, orders and prohibitions related to the introduction of the state of pandemic, increase security measures accompanying the Conference. The amendment to the Rules and Regulations will take effect within 7 days of their publication on the Conference Website. Participants who accepted the Rules and Regulations before the change, the change will take effect within 7 days after they are informed of the change in the Rules and Regulations by e-mail and do not object to the change within the aforementioned term.
9. The Organizer reserves the right to amend the Regulations also in the case of a change that does not adversely affect the rights of the Participants or a change involving the correction of obvious typographical errors and editorial mistakes. In such case the change of Regulations may become effective within less than 7 days, but not

less than 3 days from informing the Participants about the change of Regulations by e-mail and not expressing any objection to the change within the aforementioned period.

10. The Organizer reserves the right to change the date and formula of the Conference in a situation when its holding in the date and form referred to in paragraph 1 above will be impossible or excessively difficult for reasons beyond the control of the Organizer, in particular due to restrictions, orders and prohibitions related to the introduction of a pandemic. The change of the date and/or formula of the Conference will be immediately announced on the Conference Website. The change of the date and/or formula of the Conference will be immediately announced on the Conference Website.

11. The Organizer reserves the right to make changes to the Conference program, including the right to change the time schedule and order of speeches. In case of changes, the Organizer will immediately announce it on the Conference Page. The change of the Conference program does not constitute an amendment to the Regulations.

§ 2

Registration of participation in the Conference

1. Participation in the Conference is chargeable, with the exception of Keynote speakers and Guests, who are not subject to payment and requires prior registration through a registration form (hereinafter referred to as the "Form") available on the Conference Site, in which a person wishing to participate in the Conference will be required to indicate the following data: name, email address, affiliation.

2. The detailed method of registration for participation in the Conference, registration deadlines and the amount of the Registration Fee (hereinafter referred to as the "Fee"), as well as the method of its payment are provided on the Conference Site.

3. In case of cancellation of participation in the Conference, the Participant is obliged to immediately inform the Organizer by sending the relevant information to the e-mail address: konferencjaturystyka@uj.edu.pl. The Participant who resigns from participation in the Conference by May 10, 2024, in the manner referred to in this paragraph, the Organizer will refund the Fee (bank charges are not refundable). Cancellation of participation in the Conference made after May 10, 2024 will result in no refund of the Fee paid by the Participant. Refunds of Fees will be made by the Organizer after the Conference.

4. Participation in the Conference may take two forms of participation (hereinafter referred to as "Participation Forms"):

a) online, i.e. in real time, through a Platform designated by the Organizer, which the registered Participant will access through a link sent to him/her by the Organizer to the email address indicated in the Form (hereinafter referred to as "Online Form" or "Online Participant");

b) in person, through the Participant's appearance at the Conference venue (hereinafter referred to as the "In-Person Participation Form" or "In-Person Participant", respectively). The Participant selects one of the Conference Participation Forms by checking the appropriate box in the Form.

5. The Organizer shall not be responsible for the Participant's provision of erroneous or false data during the registration of participation in the Conference.

6. In the Conference, in:

a) Online form may be attended by a maximum of 200 Participants;

b) Form of in-person participation may be attended by a maximum of 150 Participants.

The acceptance of the application of a given Form of participation in the Conference is determined by the order of applications, with the reservation that the above criterion does not apply to applications sent by persons invited by the Organizer to participate in the Conference as a Guest and Keynote speaker, who are entitled to priority of participation in the Conference. A participant will receive an e-mail from the Organizer with information on

whether or not he/she has been qualified to participate in the Conference in the form of participation he/she has chosen.

7. Limits of participation in the Conference indicated in point 6 above may change due to the epidemiological situation prevailing during the Conference and related restrictions, orders and prohibitions. The Organizer will immediately notify about the change of limits on the Conference Site. If it is necessary to reduce the number of Conference Participants qualified for the Form of personal participation, the Organizer will re-qualify the Participants referred to in point 4(b) above within the available limits, taking into account the order of their applications. The Organizer will inform by email, Participants who, due to the change of limits, will not be able to participate in the Conference in the Form of in-person participation, such persons will have the opportunity to participate in the Conference in the Form of online, through the Platform within the available limits and after communicating such a wish to the Organizer.

8. Participation in the Conference in the online form requires the Participant to have an ICT system that meets the following minimum technical requirements:

a) Internet access;

b) a terminal device;

c) software that allows reading files in various formats (including text, audio, graphics, multimedia, video, etc.);

9. The person registering participation in the Conference confirms that he/she has read the Regulations and accepts the provisions of the Regulations, which is tantamount to his/her granting the permissions, licenses and authorizations referred to in the Regulations, and also constitutes a commitment to pay the Fee (the commitment does not apply to Guests and Keynote speakers, who are not subject to the Fee). Registration of participation in the Conference is completed when the Participant's data are completed in the content of the Form and sent together with the consents referred to in § 5-8 of the Regulations using the registration system located on the Conference Site.

10. The person registering for participation acquires a place of participation in the Conference upon receipt of confirmation of registration, upon payment of the Fee, and in the case of Guests and Keynote speakers upon receipt of confirmation of registration.

§ 3

General rules of participation in the Conference

1. During the Conference there will be:

a) speeches (hereinafter referred to as "Speeches") by Guests invited by the Organizer;

b) plenary sessions, sectional sessions and special sessions during which speakers selected by the Organizer based on the provisions of § 5 points 1-3 of the Regulations (hereinafter referred to as "Speakers") will deliver lectures (hereinafter referred to as "Lectures");

c) lectures of Keynote Speakers invited by the Organizer to participate in the Conference (hereinafter referred to as "Lectures").

The Conference will be held in Polish and English. Detailed information and the exact program of the Conference are available on the Conference Website.

2. The Conference will also include a banquet (hereinafter referred to as the "Banquet") to be attended by persons invited by the Organizer. Detailed information about the Banquet and the rules of participation in it will be posted on the Conference Site. Each Stationary Participant of the Conference has the right to raise questions by raising his/her hand. Participants using the Online Form may submit their questions via chat available on the Platform. From among the submitted questions, the chat moderator will select those to be asked to the Speakers

and Keynote Speakers. The organizer, taking into account the planned duration of the Lectures, as well as the Conference schedule, will decide on the number of questions to be asked and their content.

3. The course of the Conference, including both the Online Form and the Form of stationary participation, will be recorded in the form of a photo report (hereinafter referred to as "Photo Report"). As of 13.05.2024, the Organizer will indefinitely make the Photoreport available to an unlimited audience who will be able to view it on the Conference Website and on each Organizer's website and each Organizer's social media profiles, including university profiles (in particular, Facebook, Instagram).

4. The Conference Organizer, while providing the Participants with the Conference materials (hereinafter referred to as the "Conference Materials"), pays particular attention to the need for the Participants to respect intellectual property rights. Participants agree to use the Conference Materials made available to them by the Organizer only for their own personal use. Modification, copying, transmission, public reproduction and any use of these Conference Materials for commercial purposes requires the prior written consent of the Organizer or any other authorized entity. Participants shall be held fully responsible for any damage caused by their behavior contrary to the above.

5. Participants accept the established rules of the Conference and its program and agree not to influence or disrupt the Conference. The Organizer is entitled to exclude from participation in the Conference Participants who violate the provisions of the Rules and Regulations, in particular:

- a) disrupt the Conference;
- b) take actions that are unlawful, against good morals or harm the legitimate interests of third parties;
- c) take actions aimed at circumventing or indicating an attempt to circumvent the Regulations or the rules of holding the Conference;
- d) take actions that violate the legitimate interests of the Organizer or harm its image.

6. The Conference Organizer shall not be liable for:

- a) incorrect or defective operation of the software used by the Participant;
- b) lack or interruption of Internet access for reasons attributable to the Participant;
- c) defective computer equipment used by the Participant;
- d) improper operation of the Platform by the Participant;
- e) other circumstances preventing or hindering participation in the Conference not caused by the actions or omissions of the Organizer.

§ 4

Rights and obligations of Stationary Participants and Banquet Participants

1. Stationary participant upon arrival at the Conference venue is required to confirm his/her personal participation in the Conference at the reception desk in the lobby of the building of the Faculty of Management and Social Communication, 4 Łojasiewicza Street, Kraków.
2. Stationary participants and Banquet Participants are required to comply with safety rules, occupational health and safety regulations and fire safety regulations in force on the premises where the Conference and/or Banquet are held.
3. The Organizer is not responsible for items left or lost during the Conference and/or Banquet and for items left in clothing or backpacks/bags/suitcases returned to the checkroom, as well as in other public areas on the premises of the Conference, the Jagiellonian University and in the restaurant of the Campanille Hotel where the Banquet will be held.
4. The Conference staff, in the event that the Participant disturbs public order and order and fails to comply with the sanitary regime in effect on the day of the Conference, shall be entitled to:

- a) call on the Participant to behave appropriately;
 - b) demand that the Participant leave the Conference area;
 - c) summon the appropriate services in a situation where the Participant's behavior qualifies for such intervention, including, in particular, when it poses a threat to other Participants or the Conference staff or the Organizer's property.
5. The Organizer is not responsible for events resulting from the failure of Participants to comply with the Rules and Regulations, the failure of Participants to comply with the recommendations of the Organizer and the instructions of the Conference staff and services responsible for security and order.
6. In order to ensure security on the Conference premises, the Organizer may use monitoring covering the entire Conference area, as well as its individual parts. The rules for the use of monitoring by the Organizer are set forth in Order No. 34 of the Rector of the Jagiellonian University dated May 16, 2019 on: Regulations for Video Monitoring at the Jagiellonian University, as amended, available in the Public Information Bulletin of the Jagiellonian University.
7. In the event of noticing a threat to the life and health of Participants, the Participant is obliged to immediately inform the Conference staff.

§ 5

Lectures, Presentations

1. By registering for the Conference via the Form, the Participant may notify the Organizer of his/her desire to deliver a Lecture. Applications shall be accepted until 09.05.2024, 23:59 h.
2. A Participant who has applied to deliver a Lecture, no later than 09.05.2024, 23:59 h, shall send to the Organizer via the Form available on the Conference Website, in the form of a digital text file - an author's abstract of the Lecture that he/she intends to deliver during the Conference (hereinafter referred to as the "Abstract"). By 10.05.2024 at the latest, the Scientific Committee, on the basis of the submitted Abstracts, will select the Speakers, and will immediately inform the Participants whose Abstracts have been qualified about the positive result of this qualification by sending them a return e-mail message to the addresses indicated by them in the Form when registering for participation in the Conference, by 10.05.2024 at the latest. Further contact aimed at determining the details of the Speaker's speech will take place in a manner agreed upon by the Speaker with the Organizer.
3. In making the decisions referred to in point 2 above, the Scientific Committee shall be guided in its own discretion and by the need to ensure a high scientific level and thematic diversity of the Conference. The decision of the Scientific Committee is final and does not require justification, Participants are not entitled to appeal against it.
4. Persons who have accepted the Organizer's invitation to participate in the Conference as Keynote Speakers shall register their participation in the Conference according to the terms and conditions indicated in the Regulations and no later than 09.05.2024, 23:59 h and agree with the Organizer on the content of the Lecture they will deliver during the Conference.
5. Undertaking by the Participant of the actions referred to in points 1-3 above is an expression of granting to each Organizer a non-exclusive, unlimited in time, territory, quantity and quality license to use the Abstract, with a scope and fields of exploitation analogous to those referred to in § 6 points 5-7 of the Regulations, with the right to grant sublicenses to third parties with a scope analogous to the scope of the license, and to exercise and authorize the exercise of copyrights of the Abstract, for the purposes of deciding on the qualification of the Participant as a Speaker, preparation, organization, conduct and settlement of the Conference, development of the Conference Materials, including the book of abstracts, which will be provided to the Participants in printed

form, on the first day of the Conference, when they confirm their arrival at the Conference venue, in accordance with the provisions of § 4 section 1 of the Regulations. The provisions of § 6 points 1-3 and 8-9 of the Regulations shall apply to the Abstract accordingly.

6. Delivery of the Lecture by the Speaker / Keynote speaker, presentation of the Speech by the Guest, as well as granting to the Organizer the permissions, authorizations and licenses referred to in § 5-7 of the Regulations for the use of the Abstract, Lecture / Speech and image of the Speaker / Keynote speaker / Guest.

Keynote speaker/ Guest, to the extent and in all fields of exploitation indicated therein, shall be free of charge and shall be for the statutory purposes of the Organizer.

7. The granting to the Organizer of permits, licenses, authorizations referred to in § 5-7 of the Regulations is voluntary, but necessary for the presentation of the Lecture / Speech.

§ 6

Copyright

1. The Speaker/ Keynote speaker shall bear full responsibility for the form and content of the Lecture. A Lecture within the meaning of the Regulations is an oral presentation made by the Speaker / Keynote speaker during the Conference and optionally accompanied by a slide show or multimedia presentation.

2. The Speaker / Keynote speaker undertakes to develop and present an author's Lecture and guarantees that the Lecture will not violate the rights and personal rights of third parties, contain theses and views inciting hatred or discrimination against any person on the basis of race, culture, ethnicity, religion, worldview or gender. In addition, it is unacceptable to promote in the content of the Lecture the ideology and symbolism associated with totalitarian regimes, as well as the presentation of other topics prohibited by generally applicable laws.

3. If any part of the Lecture consists of legally protected elements, the rights to which shall not be vested in the Speaker/Keynote speaker, the Speaker/Keynote speaker warrants that he/she is entitled to use them to the extent necessary to deliver the Lecture and to grant to the Organizer a License with the right to grant sublicenses referred to in this paragraph, without the need for the Organizer to obtain additional consents and permissions.

4. The Speaker/Keynote speaker agrees that the Lecture may be broadcast in real time using live streaming of the Lecture via the Platform and may be recorded by any Organizer or entity acting on behalf of the Organizer, in the form of a Photorecording.

5. The Speaker/Keynote speaker separately grants each Organizer a non-exclusive, time- and territory-limited, quantitative and qualitative license, with the right to grant sub-licenses analogous to the scope of the license, to use the Lecture - recorded in the form of a Photoreport in whole or in part, individually, as a part of a collective work, in combination with works and elements freely selected by the Organizer (including, but not limited to, with Lectures of other Speakers/Keynote Speakers, with the graphic design of the Platform, with images and sound, as part of the so-called Conference Materials), as well as with its materials. Among others, with the Lectures of other Speakers/Keynote speakers, with the graphic design of the Platform, with images and sound, including as part of the so-called "Conference Materials". Conference materials), as well as with its elaborations, adaptations and all materials, graphics, fragments, shots, documentation created both in the course of capturing the Photo Report and after its capturing - for informational, documentary, educational, didactic purposes, and promotion of each Organizer and the Conference itself, archival purposes, including, in particular, its use, sharing on the Internet, Intranet, as well as within any telecommunication services using any systems and devices, on the Conference Website and on the websites of each Organizer and the social media profiles of each Organizer, including university profiles (in particular Facebook, Instagram).

6. The license referred to in point 5 above (hereinafter referred to as the “License”) shall be granted to the Organizer upon transmission of the Speaker's/Keynote speaker's Lecture using live streaming and its recording in the form of a Photo Report, and shall include the use of the Lecture in the following fields of exploitation the following fields of exploitation:

- a) recording and reproduction of the Lecture - production of copies of the Lecture using all available techniques, including printing, reprography, magnetic recording and digital techniques (including DVD, magneto-optical media);
- b) permanent or temporary reproduction of the Lecture in whole or in part by any means and in any form;
- c) in terms of dissemination of the Lecture - public performance, exhibition, display, reproduction, as well as broadcasting and rebroadcasting, as well as making the Lecture available to the public in such a way that anyone can access it at a place and time of their own choosing, using any available techniques, including use on the Internet, Intranet and other computer networks, posting and modifying the Lecture on websites, social networks, broadcasting the Lecture using multimedia and data communications networks, modification of the Lecture to create website navigation, making the Lecture publicly available at publicly accessible exhibitions or displays;
- d) with regard to the circulation of the original or copies on which the Lecture has been fixed - the marketing, lending or leasing of the original or copies;
- e) creation and distribution of derivative works of the Lecture, including further projects/materials based on the Lecture or their individual elements, including development of different graphic, color or visual or spatial versions of the Lecture, and use of such created derivative works to the extent and in all fields of exploitation specified in this paragraph;
- f) re-broadcasting, distribution in the press, on the Internet, on large-format posters and in all other forms of promotion;
- (g) to modify the Lecture in whole or in part and to make arrangements for the Lecture in whole or in part, including, but not limited to, the right to revise, make alterations and changes to the Lecture as a whole or its individual elements;
- h) the right to freely use and exploit the Lecture and its individual elements, including the use of the Lecture and its individual elements for purposes, promotion, office, purposes of marking goods, products, services, including their use as registered or unregistered trademarks, logos or their elements, use as the name/company name of a company, entrepreneur or business activity conducted, the use of the Lecture and its individual elements for the promotion of any Organizer or activity conducted by the University in the country and abroad.

7. The license shall also include the right for each Organizer and persons acting on its behalf to exercise derivative rights to the Lecture, in all fields of exploitation referred to in points 5-6 above, including in particular the right to make changes to the Lecture and perform its development, use and dispose of derivative works, and the right to allow third parties to exercise derivative copyrights to the Lecture with a scope analogous to that used by the Organizer.

8. The Speaker/Keynote speaker authorizes the Organizer and entities to which the Organizer grants further authorizations to exercise his/her moral copyrights in the Lecture, in particular the right to inviolability of the content and form of the Lecture and its fair use, to decide on the first release of the Lecture to the public, to supervise the use of the Lecture and to decide on the manner of designation of the author of the Lecture, and undertakes not to exercise these rights against the Organizer and entities authorized by the Organizer, with the proviso that the Organizer, at the request of the Speaker/Keynote speaker and to the extent possible, shall respect the wish of the Speaker/Keynote speaker as to the designation of him/her as the person presenting the Lecture.

9. In the event that third parties make claims against the Organizer and/or entities acting on behalf of the Organizer and/or entities authorized by the Organizer to use the Lecture and/or the Abstract (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Entitled Entities"), claims having to do with the Lecture and/or the Abstract or individual elements thereof, the Keynote Speaker(s):

a) shall indemnify the Organizer and/or the Eligible Entities from the claims in question, to the extent that he/she was obligated to acquire from third parties the rights to the legally protected elements of the Lecture and/or the Abstract, including the copyright and related rights therein and their individual elements, the right to exercise and permit the exercise of subsidiary rights, and to obtain from them the permits and authorizations referred to in this paragraph; and

b) shall be fully liable for any damages incurred by the Organizer and/or the Entitled Entities for making the claims referred to above against them, including primarily, but not exclusively, damages related to a claim for compensation for unlawful use of the Lecture and/or the Abstract or unlawful use of their elements.

10. The provisions of points 1-9 above shall apply mutatis mutandis to Speeches presented by Guests.

§ 7

Image

1. The Organizer shall transmit the course of the Conference via the Platform, and furthermore record it by means of devices recording the image in the form of a photo-report (hereinafter referred to as "Photo-report") for educational, didactic, informational, documentary archiving purposes, and promotion of each Organizer and the Conference itself.

2. Switching on the online camera of the terminal device by the Participant is tantamount to granting the Organizer unlimited permission in terms of time, territory, quantity and quality to transmit his/her image in real time with the use of live streaming of the Conference via the Platform and to record this image within the Photoreportation - under the terms referred to in point 3(b) below, without the right to remuneration for the above, for the purposes referred to in point 1 above.

3. The stationary participant, declaring in the Form his desire to participate in the Conference in person, agrees to the use of his image, unlimited in time, territory, quantity and quality, for the purposes referred to in point 1 above, without the right to remuneration on the aforementioned account, in particular through:

a) transmission of his/her image in real time for the purposes of coverage of the Conference, through the Platform, using live streaming;

b) recording of the Participant's image in the photo-report and use of this recording, processing, reproduction by all means, with the use of all techniques and devices, and repeated dissemination of the Participant's image recorded in the aforementioned manner without the need for its approval each time, to the extent and in a manner analogous to that referred to in § 6 points 5-7 of the Regulations, including in particular on the Conference Website and on the websites of each Organizer and the social media profiles of each Organizer, including university profiles (in particular Facebook, Instagram).

4. A Participant who is a Speaker/Keynote speaker/Guest, by notifying/confirming to the Organizer his/her willingness to deliver a Lecture/Speech and by sending him/her a Lecture Abstract for this purpose, gives his/her unlimited temporal, territorial, quantitative and qualitative consent to the use of his/her image, for the purposes indicated in point 1 above, without the right to remuneration for the above, in particular by:

a) transmitting his/her image in real time for the purposes of coverage of the Conference, via the Platform, using live streaming;

b) recording of the image of the Speaker/ Keynote speaker/ Guest in the Photo Report, as well as use of this recording, processing, reproduction by any means, with the use of any techniques and devices, and repeated

dissemination of the image recorded in the manner indicated above, without the need for its approval each time, to the extent and in a manner analogous to that referred to in § 6 points 5-7 of the Regulations, on the Conference Website and on the websites of each Conference Organizer and the social media profiles of each Organizer, including university profiles (in particular Facebook, Instagram).

5. the Participant, including those who are Speakers/Keynote speakers/Guests, is aware that the Conference Photo Report will be made available on the Internet and will be available on the Conference Website and on the websites of its Organizers and on their social media profiles of each Organizer, including on university profiles (in particular Facebook, Instagram) for an unlimited number of people, indefinitely, during the period from 13/05/2024.

6. In connection with the use of the image, the Participant, including those who are /Prelegent/ Keynote speaker/ Guest, shall not exercise the right to control and approve each time the use of the image, including the right of approval in relation to the final form of the Photo Report in which it was used, and the right each time to indicate him as a person shown in the Photo Report and transmission through the Platform, and in particular to indicate his name and surname.

7. The Conference may be photographed in the form of Photo Report only by the Organizer. It is forbidden for Participants to record and take photos during the Conference without the prior consent of the Organizer.

8. The Organizer has the right to authorize other entities to use the image under the terms of this permission.

§ 8

Processing of personal data

Pursuant to Article 13 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of April 27, 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation Data Protection Regulation, hereinafter referred to as "RODO"), the Jagiellonian University informs that:

1. the administrator of the Participant's personal data is:

b) PTE Szczecin Branch, has appointed a Data Protection Inspector. Contact with the Inspector is possible via e-mail: pte@szczecin.pl - from Monday to Friday, from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm.

2. The Participant's personal data will be processed for:

a) the performance of the contract, the subject of which is participation in the 13th International Conference "Tourism in the Social Sciences", as well as for the purpose of registration of participation in the Conference, i.e., on the basis of Article 6 pt. 1it. b RODO, on the basis of the agreement concluded by accepting the Regulations. The conference organized on 13-14.05.2024 by the Faculty of Management and Social Communication of the Jagiellonian University and PTE Szczecin Branch will be held hybrid;

b) to carry out Photo-reporting of the Conference for documentation, informational, educational, didactic purposes, advertising and promotion of the Organizer, and the Conference itself, archiving - with regard to personal data of the Participants in the form of image - based on the legitimate interest of the Organizer, i.e. based on Art. 6 par. 1 lit. f RODO in the case of the stationary part in order to ensure the security of the Conference in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Jagiellonian University on video surveillance available at <https://bip.uj.edu.pl/> and the information obligation regarding the processing of image in video

surveillance available at <https://iod.uj.edu.pl/monitoring-wizyjny> on the basis of Article 6(1)(e) RODO - with regard to data from video surveillance.

3. Provision by the Participant of personal data referred to in item. 3(a) above is necessary for the conclusion of the contract, participation in the Conference,. Provision of personal image data referred to in item. 3 lit. b above is voluntary. With regard to the data referred to in item. 3 lit. c above is voluntary, but failure to provide them - due to the obligation to ensure the safety of Participants of the stationary part - results in the inability to participate in the Conference.
4. Participant's personal data may be made available to entities entitled to receive them under generally applicable laws.
5. Participants' personal data will not be transferred to third countries (outside the European Economic Area) or to international organizations.
6. Participants' personal data will be stored for the period of organization of the Conference and until the final settlement and closing of the Conference, as well as until the statute of limitations for claims that may arise from the execution of the agreement referred to in point 3(a), and to the extent indicated in point 3(b) above - until the Participant objects to the processing of the data. Video surveillance data will be processed for a maximum of 3 months.
7. Personal data of the Participant provided in the Registration Form will not be shared with third parties.
8. Personal data of the Participant in the form of image may be recorded on the photos from the Conference used to create a photo-report and processed on the Conference website, <https://przedsiebiorczosc.uj.edu.pl/nauka/konferencje> in a manner that allows access by third parties, for informational, documentary, educational, didactic, advertising and promotional purposes of the Organizer, and the Conference itself, as well as archiving, including coverage of the Conference - in accordance with the Rules.
9. The participant has the right to: obtain information about the processing of his/her personal data and his/her rights under the RODO, access to the content of his/her data and their rectification, as well as the right to delete his/her personal data from the Administrator's files (unless further processing is necessary for the performance of a legal obligation or to establish, assert or defend claims), and the right to limit processing, data portability, object to processing - in the cases and under the conditions specified in the RODO.
10. The Participant's personal data will not be subject to automated decision-making or profiling.
11. the Participant has the right to lodge a complaint with the President of the Office for Personal Data Protection if he/she considers that the processing of your personal data violates the provisions of the RODO.

THE MAIN CONTENT OF THE JOINT ARRANGEMENTS **(excerpt from the agreement on the joint management of personal data)**

Pursuant to Article 26 of the RODO, we inform you that the Co-administrators, with the identities specified below, have entered into the following arrangements:

1. Co-administrators of the personal data of the Conference Participants are:
 - Jagiellonian University, 24 Gołębia St., 31-007 Krakow, represented by the Rector of the Jagiellonian University.
 - PTE Szczecin Branch, 66 Mickiewicza St., 71-101 Szczecin , represented by Prof. US Barbara Kryk, Ph.D. - Branch President and Prof. US Anna Drab-Kurowska, Ph.D. - Branch Vice President.
2. Co-administrators shall jointly process personal data of the Conference Participants in connection with the performance of tasks assigned to them in the organization and conduct of the Conference in accordance with the principles of personal data processing set forth in Article 5 of RODO.

3. The provision of this information constitutes the sharing of the essential content of the joint arrangements of the Co-administrators, whose identities are indicated in the first point above, for the joint processing of personal data of the Conference Participants and based on the legal grounds indicated in the information obligation addressed to the Conference Participants.
4. In accordance with the joint arrangements of the Co-administrators, we inform you that each of the Co-administrators is responsible for:
- a) the handling of the Joint Information Clause on the principles of personal data processing by the Co-administrators, including the essential content of their arrangements for the discharge of their obligations regarding the protection of personal data;
 - b) processing of personal data in accordance with the principles set forth in Article 5 of the RODO;
 - c) proper safeguarding of personal data from the moment of receipt of documentation with personal data;
 - d) the realization of the rights of individuals referred to in Articles 15-22 of the RODO, taking into account possible restrictions under the law;
 - e) maintaining documentation describing how personal data are processed, including a register of data processing activities (a requirement of Article 30 RODO);
 - f) securing personal data in accordance with Article 32 RODO, in particular against access by unauthorized persons;
 - g) notification, in coordination with the other Co-administrators, to the supervisory authority of a breach referred to in Article 33 RODO occurring within its own structures;
 - h) notifying a person of a data breach if it may cause a high risk of violation of the rights or freedoms of individuals.
5. When co-managing personal data, at any stage of processing, each of the Co-administrators shall ensure that data subjects exercise their rights under the RODO.
6. In the event that a data subject directs his/her request for the exercise of a right directly to one of the Co-administrators, each of the Co-administrators shall be responsible for promptly forwarding the data subject's request to the appropriate Co-administrators. Please be advised that notwithstanding the arrangements indicated in points 3-4 above, data subjects personal data subjects may exercise their rights under the RODO against each of the Co-administrators, which means that a request to exercise rights addressed to each of the Co-administrators is a request made in accordance with the RODO.

§ 9

Final Provisions

1. These Regulations are made available to Conference Participants on the Conference Website and shall come into force on the date of their posting on the aforementioned website.
2. The Organizer reserves the right to cancel the Conference. The Organizer shall immediately inform about the cancellation of the Conference on the Conference Website. The Organizer shall not be liable to the Participants, including Keynote Speakers/Guests/Presenters, for any compensation or damages on this account, nor for reimbursement of costs incurred to participate in the Event, except for reimbursement of the Fee.
3. The contract of participation in the Conference concluded by accepting the Regulations shall be governed by Polish law. In matters not covered by the Regulations, generally applicable provisions of Polish law shall apply, in particular the Civil Code and the Act on Copyright and Related Rights.

4. These Regulations have been drawn up in two language versions - Polish and English language, in case of doubts of interpretation the Polish language version shall prevail.
5. All disputes shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the Polish courts of general jurisdiction.
